## Treasury, JD Damon

JD reported that with all expenses accounted for we started the year with \$6300 in the bank. Income for the year was \$12,683 and all expenses were noted, (report attached), resulting in an ending balance of \$6337, up \$37 from last year! The annual show

represents 40% of our income, with dues adding another 20%, the balance being regalia sales and sponsor donations.

As is our custom, we made donations to charities in 2016. \$1,000 to The Little Pantry That Could, \$1,000 to Gatlinburg Wildfire Relief Fund, \$500 to Baptist Children's Home, and as previously noted Franktown Open Hearts.

Chip and Ken then worked our member sign-up sheets for this year's upcoming monthly drives and diners. It took a couple attempts, and some gentle arm twisting, but within 15 minutes we had all the slots filled, what a great club!

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30pm, and members assisted in clean-up of the facility.
